Dear children and parents,

Happy New Year and welcome to the spring term in Kingfishers' class. Please find attached an overview of the curriculum in each subject.

Mayan Madness is our topic for the spring term with an emphasis on geography and DT: How did the Maya transport goods and what did they trade? We will discover their impressive expertise, the logistics and the daunting geography that they had to overcome. Children will find out how they knew about the wheel, but didn't use it. They will take part in role-play trading games, make models and maps.

PE will be on Wednesday, which will be dance and hockey. Children will be completing the daily mile; always needing a pair of trainers in school. To make the most of any opportunities for unprompted outdoor learning, it is best to ensure that PE kits remain in school during weekdays. Please could you ensure that children are provided with a **full PE kit**. See our school website for details.

Kingfishers' *library slot is on Tuesday*, where children can browse our selection and books and choose a new read weekly.

An exciting *school trip*, with geography and STEM foci, has been organized to see behind the scenes of Stansted Airport! This will take place on *Friday 15th February* jointly with Frogs' class. *Sports Hall Athletics* is happening on *23rd January*. Letters with more details will follow.

Home-learning grids have been sent home with your child today. I expect all children to read for 15 minutes daily, and practise times tables to keep them fresh: www.mathletics.com is a helpful resource for this. I am also inviting children to spend 1 hour per week on completing home-learning tasks from the grid. This can be achieved by either choosing one task per week, or spending longer completing a task over a series of weeks. If you find this difficult, please aim to complete one task per week. The home-learning grid has enough tasks to last the entire term. Children are welcome to decorate and personalise the cover of their home-learning books as they see fit. We will share, celebrate and give feedback to children on the last Friday afternoon before each half term. (Friday 8th February & Friday 29th March)
