Dear Parents,

This Friday, we held our annual Harvest service, down at the Debden St. Mary the Virgin Church. It was lovely to see the children presenting some of their work, singing harvest hymns and listening to harvest readings. I would like to extend a big thank you to Rev. John for piecing together and leading the service. As well as leading services such as these and collective worship sessions in the school, Rev. John is also a school governor and a vital support to our staff and children, and we feel exceptionally lucky to have him as such a strong link with our local church.

Here are a few notices that we have collated to help you to stay in the loop of events and activities taking place at school over the coming weeks:

- -<u>Student Council</u> The student council has now been formed congratulations to all of the children who have been elected. They will be meeting together for the first time over the next week, with Miss Rowe (who is leading the student council this year). I am often asked about Head Boy and Head Girl positions these positions are now allocated to the Year 6 representatives of the student council.

Please can they attend in their PE kits. On Thursday 14th October, the Frogs class will be hosting a museum visit about fossils, to enrich their learning in science on rocks.
