Dear Parents,

A warm welcome back to school after the half term break. We hope that you and your families managed to enjoy the time together – despite the stormy weather!

The school has grown in numbers again at the start of this term, and we will imminently reach 130 children on roll. The school has not had this many children since back in 2014 (in 2019 we had 82 children at one point) and it is lovely to see the playground full at breaktimes and the hall close to capacity during worship, lunchtimes and assemblies. To all of our new families: welcome, and to everybody else in our community, thank you for helping to spread the good word about our lovely school!

Below are some important news items and notices regarding upcoming events:

-<u>World Book Day</u>: We are excited to be celebrating World Book Day on <u>Thursday 3rd March</u>. The children are invited to come to school <u>dressed as their favourite book character</u>. Throughout the day the children will be taking part in lots of book-related activities including teacher's childhood favourites and a 'House Team' read, to name a few.

FODS will be running a '<u>Book Swap'</u> in the library throughout the day. The children are invited to bring in a pre-loved book they are happy to part with and swap for a new book- a great way to share much loved stories and recycle some classics. We ask that children also bring a <u>£1 donation</u> to put towards our exciting library refurbishment we are planning for the Summer term. All money donated will go to revamping, re-stocking and freshening up our school library.
